Sacraments: Signs and Symbols

Completion of this assignment will be due back to your religion teacher no later than **Friday, August 16th**. A grade will be taken and applied to 1st quarter Religion homework assignments.

There are 7 sacraments the Catholic Church celebrates. As defined in the 5th Grade Religion, *We Believe* textbook, a sacrament is "an effective sign given to us by Jesus through which we share in God's life."

PART 1:

- Do a bit of research to name and describe each sacrament in 3-5 complete sentences. In your description you can explain what the sacrament is, for what purpose it is received, how it is carried out, who is able to receive it, etc.
 - Complete this task on a separate sheet of paper; it may be typed using a computer or handwritten in cursive.

PART 2:

- Do a bit of research to identify 3-5 signs and symbols of each of the sacraments.
- On a poster board, allot space for all 7 sacraments then draw and label 3-5 symbols and signs for each of them.
 - The poster board should not be smaller than a 11"x14" poster and no larger than a 22"x28" poster.
